*We hope people around the world will continue to fall in love with Chevrolets and smile when they call their favorite car, truck or crossover "Chevy."*

# CCOH By-Laws Change Proposal

In accordance with the By-Laws of the Corvette Club of Hawaii, the Board of Directors has drafted a set of By-Law Amendments to be discussed and voted on by the membership at the General Membership Meeting on the evening of Tuesday, July 6, 2010.

Proposed By-Law Revisions:

## Article II Section 5

### Section 5 Ineligible Members

- a. CCOH members that are also joint members in any other organized Car Club are ineligible to run for any position on the Board of Directors.
- b. Persons joining the club that have tentatively tendered their resignation either voluntarily or involuntarily from an organized Car Club will not be eligible to run for the Board of Directors for a minimum of two years after joining the Club.
- c. Members that resign from an organized Car Club while also being members of CCOH will have to wait a minimum of two years before being eligible to run for the Board of Directors. In order to be eligible a copy of a letter of resignation addressed to the respective Car Club shall be submitted to the Club Secretary and held on record until such time the two years has expired.
