I went over and helped the young owner out with his 1990 Corvette. He had just returned from a ship's deployment so the battery was dead, and he did not know that he needed to keep the car running for a bit after jumping it so it would not shut off. After keeping it running for about 15 minutes, he drove off. Apparently, the car was running fine, although the starter motor probably needs to be replaced in the not-too-distant future. I gave the owner a card for the Corvette Club of Hawaii (and for his fellow shipmates with Corvettes) then got dinner and drove home. On the way home, I came across a broken down 2012 Silver C6 Grand Sport on the Red Hill exit to the Moanalua Freeway, right next to the AMR housing area. I did not want to stop, but after seeing it, I circled around and went back to help. This was a good thing because the car had shorted out and by looking at my car, we were able to figure out whomever had the car previously had done some funky wiring for a back-up camera. Removing the wiring got that car going again and, like before, I gave the owner a Corvette Club of Hawaii card. Because the C6 Grand Sport looked so much like my car and because it broke down next to AMR, the next day back in the office, 4 people asked me if my car had broken down there...which was kind of funny that I was the one to discover the problem.

For 17 years, my big one was Save the Wave, but in one hour period, I did my second of not leaving a broken-down Corvette stranded. I implore all members to do the same. Additionally, it could be a good way to get new members as our members probably know a remedy for these Corvette issues.






## NIGHT IN CHINATOWN PARADE




